

New records of Reduviidae (Hemiptera: Heteroptera) from Colombia and other Neotropical countries

Abstract

One subfamily, 27 genera, and 48 species of Reduviidae are recorded for the first time from Colombia and other Neotropical countries. Comments on those taxa, and new localities and notes for other previously known species, are given. For the first time, the female of *Opisthacidius picturatus* is described and its pronotum figured. Morphological details on *Orbella lugubris*, *Pessoaria limai*, *Phasmatocoris spectrum*, and *Pothea annulipes* are provided.

Resumen

Se registran por primera vez para Colombia y otros países neotropicales 1 subfamilia, 27 géneros y 48 especies de la familia Reduviidae. Se brindan comentarios sobre dichas especies, así como nuevas localidades y notas de otras previamente conocidas en cada uno de los países. Se describe por primera vez la hembra de *Opisthacidius picturatus* y se ilustra el pronoto. Se presentan detalles morfológicos para *Orbella lugubris*, *Pessoaria limai*, *Phasmatocoris spectrum* y *Pothea annulipes*.
