ABSTRACT

Fourteen species of *Euscelus* Schoenherr are recognized from the West Indies: *E. armatus* (Gyllenhal), *E. scutellatus* (Klug), *E. dentipes* (Fabricius), *E. angulosus* (Gyllenhal), *E. scrobiculatus* Voss, *E. uviferae* Marshall, *E. pulchellus* (Suffrian), *E. cribrarius* (Olivier), *E. biguttatus* (Fabricius), *E. sexmaculatus* (Chevrolat), *E. aureolus* (Gyllenhal), *E. haitensis* new species from Haiti, *E. postoculidens* new species and *E. dominicanus* new species from the Dominican Republic. Four previously described eusceline species from the West Indies are relegated to synonymy: *Euscelus cancellatus* Voss, new synonymy; *Euscelus callosipennis* Voss, new synonymy; *Euscelus coccolobae* (Wolcott), new synonymy and *Emphytuscelus cubensis* Janczyk, new synonymy. Specimens were unavailable for *Attelabus canaliculatus* Olivier, *Attelabus spinifex* Olivier and *Attelabus fornicatus* Olivier and they are not included. Lectotypes are designated for *E. uviferae* and *E. pulchellus*. A key separating West Indian euscelines is provided and the species are covered in standard taxonomic fashion including habitus images and aedeagal illustrations.
