Taxonomic notes on *Amemboa lyra* Paiva and *Amemboa riparia* Polhemus & Andersen (Hemiptera: Heteroptera: Gerridae)

Abstract

Amemboa ripiaria Polhemus & Andersen, 1984 was recognised as junior synonym of Amemboa lyra (Paiva, 1918) by Zettel & Chen (1996). After examination of a series of Amemboa specimens from Myanmar, we now determine that these two names are not synonymous and thus re-establish Amemboa riparia. These species can be separated from each other by the structures of the male's fore leg, and the apical part of the pygophore.

Introduction

Amemboa lyra was first described as Onychotrechus lyra by Paiva (1918) from southern Shan State, Myanmar. The type material of this species was supposedly deposited in the Zoological Survey of India, but authors of subsequent studies, e.g., Polhemus & Andersen (1984), Zettel & Chen (1996), were not successful in locating the type material. Polhemus & Andersen (1984) revised the genus Amemboa, transferred Onychotrechus lyra to Amemboa, and described Amemboa riparia, which is closely related to A. lyra. Zettel & Chen (1996) while reviewing the gerrid fauna of Vietnam, treated Amemboa riparia Polhemus & Andersen, 1984 as a junior synonym of A. lyra (Paiva, 1918), after examination of a population from northwestern Thailand with variable foreleg structures (see Remarks for A. riparia below).

After examination of a series of *Amemboa* specimens from Myanmar, in localities close to the type locality of *A. lyra*, we now determine that these two names are not synonymous and thus re-establish *Amemboa riparia*.

Materials & Methods. The materials examined in this study are deposited in the following collections: John T. Polhemus Collection, USA (JTPC); Natural History Museum, Vienna, Austria (NHMW); Zoological Museum, University of Copenhagen, Denmark (ZMUC); Zoological Reference Collection, Raffles Museum of Biodiversity Research, Singapore (ZRC) and Zoological Museum, Hanoi University of Science, Vietnam (ZMHU). Illustrations were made with the help of a Camera Lucida attached to a Nikon SMZ800 stereo-microscopes. All measurements are given in millimeters.

Taxonomy

Amemboa lyra (Paiva, 1918)

Onychotrechus lyra Paiva, 1918: 24–25, pl. 8:3 (type locality: Taung-gya, Southern Shan State, Myanmar). Amemboa (s.str.) lyra (Paiva); Polhemus & Andersen, 1984: 90, Figs. 65, 73–75 (systematics, transferred Onychotrechus lyra to Amemboa); Zettel & Chen, 1996: 156–157 (synonymized Amemboa riparia with Amemboa lyra).
