Abstract

The genus *Pupinidius* Moellendorff, 1901 is reviewed based on the examination of the majority of Chinese species. Fourteen out of sixteen known species and subspecies are re-described, most conchologically and some with details of the internal anatomy. *Pupinidius latilabrum* (Annandale, 1923), once regarded as a synonym of *P. gregorii*, is re-established. An additional species, *Pupinidius wenxian* **sp. nov.** is described from South Gansu, West China.
