YANNAN MU & FENG ZHANG (2023) Further additions to the guardstone spider fauna from China (Araneae: Phrurolithidae). *Zootaxa*, 5338 (1), 1–104.

Phrurolithidae is a family of spiders with 385 species belonging to 26 genera mainly distributed in the Northern Hemisphere (World Spider Catalog 2023). An extensive survey of phrurolithid spiders from China in recent years revealed 23 new species belonging to eight genera, including two new genera, which were recently described (Mu & Zhang 2023).

In this erratum, two species' names are proposed to replace two incorrectly constructed species names.

Page 76:

The species-group name *Pennalithus micous*, which was explicitly stated to be an adjective, is incorrectly formed and is here modified to *Pennalithus micans*. This is in accordance with the International Code of Zoological Nomenclature (1999).

Pennalithus micans Mu & Zhang, 2023

Etymology. This specific name is derived from the Latin word "*micare*", referring to the twinkling iridescent scales; adjective.

Description. See Mu & Zhang, 2023.

Page 93:

Xilithus pugious should be replaced as Xilithus pugio, because of the incorrectly constructed species name.

Xilithus pugio Mu & Zhang, 2023

Etymology. This specific name is a Latin word "*pugio*", meaning "dagger", referring to the dagger-shaped prolateral tegular apophysis; noun.

Description. See Mu & Zhang (2023).
